Background

Violence against women and girls is one of the most widespread, persistent and devastating human rights violations in our world today. It occurs globally, cutting across all generations, nationalities, communities and spheres of our societies. It is a major obstacle to the fulfilment of women's human rights and to the achievement of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

Despite international and national laws and conventions to prevent violence, and despite States' commitments to punish and eventually eradicate this dreadful phenomenon, violence persists, and in some cases, such as in times of crisis, increases drastically. One of the major difficulties in implementing effective policies to combat violence against women and girls is the lack of understanding about the underlying causes of violence rooted in continuous gender inequalities and in social constructions of masculinities and femininities, which act to normalize and reproduce relations of violence between the sexes.

This online course will allow participants to learn best practices in the areas of service provision, intervention and prevention. The course content will also relate to COVID-19 crisis and effects of the phenomena on violence.

Aims

- Analyze causes of violence against women as well as means of intervention, emphasizing cultural norms and practices
- Analyze prevention and intervention models and techniques for treatment and rehabilitation of survivors of violence
- Review intervention and treatment programs/models for male perpetrators

Main Subjects

- Violence as a phenomenon and the environment in which it occurs
- Intervention models and techniques for dealing with survivors of violence
- Emergency response services
- Rehabilitation services
- Intervention modelsaimed atperpetrators of the abuse
- Preventive measures
- Engagement of civil society organizations in combatting violence against women and girls

Target population:

The course is intended for managers working in social service and protection organizations; government and local authority officials; NGO representatives; police officers and lawyers; psychologists; social workers; crisis center teams and other health care professionals with at least 5 years of experience.

Methodology

The course will use the Zoom platform for meetings and group work enabling participants to interact with each other with the aim of creating an effective network of like-minded professionals.

Participants will need an access to computer, camera, microphone, speakers, and a stable internet connection and will be expected to participate fully in every session. A convenient, quiet and adequate working environment is extremely important.


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

About the Course

The COVID-19 pandemic has created the most massive disruption of education systems in history, affecting nearly 1.7 billion learners in almost all countries worldwide. The social distancing and quarantine during the coronavirus crisis increased the exposure of children and youth, experiencing unprecedented challenges to their lives.

Programs and responses, which are available during regular times, have been significantly reduced during the current crisis. The situation affects children and youth who already experience barriers accessing education or who are at higher risk of being excluded for a variety of reasons.

Another aspect is the reduced ability to identify and locate children and youth at risk following the closing of schools and social distancing between the children and their teachers and counselors. There is a pressing need to develop methods and guidelines for identifying needs remotely. This goal presents a significant challenge that must be met with creativity, resourcefulness, and hard work.

Within the framework of the 2030 education agenda, many stakeholders are advocating for the introduction of a learning-related goal as the most appropriate way to monitor educational progress and the prevention of early dropout rates and reducing inequality. Accessibility initiatives have been created in terms of improving quality and endeavors to improve teacher training and support. Provide relevant and modern learning materials and integrate technology and gender-sensitive practices, focusing all efforts on creating favorable conditions and individual skills to foster resiliency and offset risk factors.

In collaboration with The Youth and Society Administration, Ministry of Education of Israel, we will address the challenges of the subject face in these times.
